Why is Beechwood Cemetery collecting old Canadian Flags?

"As the National Cemetery of Canada, Beechwood is honoured to lead this initiative to respectfully retire old Canadian Flags. Many Canadians have tattered, faded, or ripped flags stored away without knowing how to properly dispose of them.

This program provides a dignified solution, ensuring that every flag is retired with honour and respect. By bringing these flags to Beechwood, Canadians can participate in a national act of remembrance and pride."

Why is cremation the only proper way to dispose of a Canadian Flag?

"Cremation is the only respectful and dignified way to retire a Canadian Flag. It ensures the flag is disposed of with honour, preventing it from being discarded in a way that could be seen as disrespectful.

At Beechwood, we use a state-of-the-art cremation facility that ensures minimal environmental impact. This method aligns with traditional practices and reflects the respect our national symbol deserves."

What is the significance of Heritage Canada's support for this initiative?

"Heritage Canada's support underscores the national importance of this program. It reinforces the role of the Maple Leaf as a symbol of our shared identity and history. Can anyone participate?

How can people send their flags?

"Canadians can mail their old flags directly to Beechwood Cemetery at:

What happens to the flags once they are collected?

"All collected flags will be respectfully placed in specially prepared containers and honoured during a solemn sunset ceremony at Beechwood Cemetery. The ceremony will include a dignified procession led by RCMP and military representatives, a new flag-raising, and a respectful cremation of the retired flags. It's a powerful tribute to our national symbol and its legacy."

Can the public attend the ceremony?

"Yes, the public is welcome to attend the sunset ceremony at Beechwood Cemetery on June 18 2025. It's a unique opportunity to witness the honour and respect given to our national symbol. For those unable to attend in person, we will be sharing highlights on social media to ensure everyone can take part, no matter where they are in Canada."

"We're actively seeking community partners to help collect flags and spread the word about the initiative. Organizations can participate by serving as collection points, promoting the program through their networks, or joining us at the ceremony.
